


Footprints ACROSS FINLAND

Helsinki

The capital of Finland, the country's sole metropolis, is a well-renowned city with an influential cultural scene that excels at design, architecture, music, and the culinary arts. Helsinki ranks as one of the most livable cities in the world, and this becomes increasingly evident the more you explore the progressive but laid back seaside capital and sample everything it has to offer.

Helsinki's reputation as a 'city of architecture' is based on two factors. The first is Finland's 800-plus years of architectural history that covered styles like Nordic Classicism, Art Nouveau, and Functionalism. Buildings like Helsinki Cathedral, the Government Palace, and Sederholm House reflect designs that are typically found in places like Sweden or Russia. The second factor is the modernist movement that heavily shaped Helsinki's electrifying urban-scape, exemplified by innovative works such as Finlandia Hall, Temppeliaukio Church, and the Amos Rex Museum.

You will find it easy to explore the compact central area by foot, and be rewarded with the abundance of attractions that include museums, quality restaurants, bars, shops, and other interesting establishments; many of them within walking distance from each other. If you find yourself in a bar, a concert, or any type of social situation, you will quickly discover that the amiable Finns do love to party—even if they may seem initially quiet and reserved.






'Sauna' is the only Finnish word that has been internationally recognized and adopted in other languages. Saying that sauna is an intrinsic part of Finland's culture and heritage is a massive understatement. In Finland, more important decisions are made inside a sauna than in a boardroom! With more than 3 million saunas in the country, relaxing inside one is a great way to chat with the locals and is arguably the best way to understand Finland and the daily life of its people.



Finland's cuisine has always been about locally sourced, seasonal, farmed, and foraged ingredients—long before such parameters became the benchmark of haute cuisine that countless chefs aspire to emulate. Typical dishes involve wild game, fish, mushrooms, or berries. Local specialties are a blend of innovative concepts, traditional techniques, and long-standing principles. Events like the Helsinki Street Food Festival showcase the best of what Finnish flavors can offer to discerning and adventurous palates.





Defined by its striking multi-era architecture, strong design foundation, vibrant cultural pulse, and reputation as an ideal place to live, Helsinki distinguishes itself from other cities along the Baltic Sea. 
Biking in Helsinki

Rovaniemi

Just beyond the Arctic Circle, Rovaniemi is the ultimate winter holiday destination, ideal for both families and solo adventurers. Surrounded by the stunning northern tundra, this is the gateway to exciting adventures involving husky or reindeer safaris, snowmobiles, and the iconic aurora borealis!

Kemi

Historically an industrious port town, Kemi has emerged as a key winter destination in Finland, thanks to its gorgeous surroundings, abundant snow, and numerous attractions such as the Snow Castle or the Sampo Icebreaker. Connected to Helsinki by both plane and train, Kemi has become a convenient escape into a culturally rich Lapland.

Saariselka

The northernmost ski resort in Finland, Saariselka is the gateway to Urho Kekkonen National Park. This lush region is surrounded by pristine national parks, attracting visitors with many outdoor activities and an insider's look into the culture of the area. Enjoy the winter wonderland or visit during summer, when the sun does not set for two whole months.

Ivalo

For a truly off-beat Finnish destination, set out to Ivalo, a quiet town with a genuine charm. Travel to the Inari district is ideal for marveling at the Northern Lights, enjoying snow activities, or interacting with the Sami culture, which continues to thrive in these lands. Just a short flight from Helsinki, Ivalo is certainly worth the detour.



Sami Culture

The only indigenous culture of Europe, the Sami people live a unique lifestyle in the northern tundra covering areas of Finland, Sweden and Norway. Reindeer husbandry is still the primary occupation in Lapland, and the deep bond between the Sami and these creature goes back centuries. With a unique language, customs, and crafts, it is a privilege to sit amongst them and learn their ancient traditions.



Snow Activities

Skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling:

Winter in Lapland starts in November and can last up until May, making it ideal for many winter activities. Set out skiing, snowshoeing through the Lappish tundra, or ride a snowmobile during one of the different safaris. Bring life to the vacation with these active adventures while spending quality time in the frozen lands of northern Finland.



Santa Claus Village

Visiting Santa has never been so easy! Just a short drive away from Rovaniemi, Santa Claus' village is a magical place right on the edge of the Arctic Circle. Children can personally meet Santa Claus and enjoy a variety of activities, while adults can stop by Christmas exhibitions, restaurants or the famous Christmas Post Office. Aurora Borealis

In Finnish folklore, it is said that the arctic fox would run so fast that sparks would rise up and create blazing colors dancing in the night sky, the Northern Lights. Rovaniemi

Snowmobiling

Whether hunting Aurora Borealis or on the Santa Claus Safari, a snowmobile ride is always an exciting adventure. Ride over frozen lakes to a typical reindeer farm, taking in the magic of these fairytale lands, seldom seen by Americans. No matter the route, a divine silence reclaims the surroundings once the snowmobile engines are off.


In a rustic lakeside hotel in the small village of Nellim explore the unspoilt nature and enjoy the Northern Lights on a tour and from the Aurora cabins.








Oulanka National Park
